As a child, coloring books were too restrictive for Bryan Bramblett. Drawing from memory and imagination was far more entertaining. Growing up in rural Oklahoma, he learned real quickly that creativity can be your best friend. The time he spent exploring the outdoors fueled that creativity.

In the mid 90's, Bramblett decided to take his passion a little more seriously. He enrolled in the art program at the University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma. He had a vision that needed fulfilled. Unfortunately he lacked the proper skills to accomplish that vision. Through many hours of hard work and dedication, he was able to develop his skills. After graduating with a BFA from USAO, he thought his drawing skills were at a proficient level. Little did he know, this was just the beginning of his education.

The "curious child" in him likes to explore all mediums. The endless possibility of the pencil has become his true passion. It allows him to achieve the results that separate his work from others. The use of values, texture, and negative/positive space are key elements in graphite.

Bramblett uses 12 different drawing pencils as well as a mechanical pencil. Achieving atmospheric conditions can be one of the most challenging aspects of what he does. Through his own observations, Mother Nature herself has revealed to him many of the things that he needs for creating art. Bramblett gladly passes this knowledge on to his students. He is an advocate for promoting the arts in his community, and enjoys helping others achieve their artistic goals.
