Gerald Copeland is one of the most sought after instructors of realistic human sculptors in this part of the country. In his Countryside Studio he teaches both clay sculpture and wood carving (actually it is wood sculptor the way Gerald does it). His studio in Holton, Kansas, hosted Tim Hataway, Steve Brandt, Richard Dalke, and James Hooper in a class where media included wood and clay. John Luna showed his "Sunflower" Christmas ornament.






Donald Boyce brought two of


