For those who do not know our local professional carver, Chuck Wright, the February meeting will give you the chance to not only meet him, you'll get to see him at work.



For the last year or so, Chuck's company, *Architectural Accents*, has been working on carvings for churches and private homes (including Bob Stoops' new home) and all this just following building a new home for his family. He even finds time to teach a woodcarving class at the Norman Vo-Tech each Saturday.

Chuck is a native Oklahoman, being raised in the Tahlequah area, where he graduated from Northeastern Oklahoma State. He has worked in the building and construction industries before becoming a full time artist. His association with

the Oklahoma Woodcarving Club goes back many years and includes serving as Show Chairman for two years. He also has been our show judge for several categories including the whittling contest.

Chuck's work on carving and restoring full size carousel animals has brought him accolades and high praise throughout our region. The photo

2013 SEMINARS

APRIL 8 & 9 Dallas Deege from Old Texas Woodcarvers will be teaching a two-day class called "Mad Art of Caricature" based on Tom Richman's book. Dallas will accept fourteen so there is one opening left for now. Again we will need alternates, so contact Jay Allen to get on you're the list. Cost of the class is \$90 which will be payable at this month's meeting. Should you not be able to make the meeting, please get your money to Jay or one of the club officers by the end of that week. There will be an additional \$10 due at the opening of the class to pay for materials and facilities. Need tools? — contact Old Texas and he can bring your order with him.

MAY 20TH - 22ND Kevin Walker will be conducting a three-day seminar on his style of relief carving. His project will be a decorative cross similar to the one that wan a blue ribbon at last year's show. The opportunity to join this class will be at this month's meeting and the cost will be \$150 plus \$60 for the project blank with the background cut back with a router and the usual \$5 for the church's facilities. A deposit will be required by March to ensure your place in the class. Additional information will be available at the club meeting.

OCTOBER 21ST – 23RD Debbie Edwards will instruct a few carvers lucky enough to have placed there names on the list. The class filled immediately, but don't despair. The alternates list is still open and there are always last minute withdrawals. Contact Pete Zachry to get on the list. Final details will be announced at a later time.
