Bark Carving with Jerry Wooliver

One of our own carvers, Jerry Wooliver, will be presenting a program on how he does the fantasy carvings in Cottonwood Bark. Jerry is one of our most prolific creators of original fantasy houses which does not require an established pattern in order to achieve a finished work. Imagination is the primary ingredient and this form of carving is the most fun when one lets their imagination run wild – just for the fun of it. Anyone who has never experienced this style of carving is in for a real treat the first time they try it.

Below are a few examples of bark carving from previous Show & Tell sessions done by members.









BOB WILLIS

Sculptor and artist, Bob Willis, provided a handson demonstration of just how one creates a human bust in clay that is an original design. He explained exactly how to use the armature and basic tools to create the work.





His presentation was specifically intended for woodcarvers or others who remove material rather the the add-on method used in most clay sculpting.

The "eye for the anatomy" is common to all sculpting efforts

so he went into some detail as to just how to get things right so everything fits properly.

Kevin Walker conducted a carving class featuring his style of High Relief. For those who don't recall, Kevin has won Best of Show two times in the past three years. Needless to say, his work is truly outstanding. The project selected for the class was a branch of Dogwood flowers and leaves. Students had a choice of Butternut or Basswood for their carvings and the class was split about half in half on the choice of wood. The Butternut received a much lesser dense paint layer but did get its flower peddles bleached. The Basswood version requires a much greater effort when it comes to painting.
