MANGLE BOARDS

Mangle Boards are a standard way of smoothing linen, from Russia to France, Iceland to Bosnia. They were in use before 1600AD. Mangle boards were traditional courtship gifts carved by young men in Scandinavia and the Netherlands, and presented to the young ladies they wished to marry, with the young lady's name carved under the handle. The mangle board would be placed on the door step of the young lady's house, if she takes it inside, she accepts the proposal. The round rolling pin is for the linen, tightly swathed around the pin. The mangle board is pressed tightly on the linen and rolled with as much force as possible.
