Les Stotler
Born: June 16, 1941
Died: March 20, 2016



Les Stotler married Katherine Joyce Poffinbarger Durham on May 20, 1961 at the Naval Air Station in Brunswick, Maine. Les served in the U.S. Navy from 1959 to 1965 and flew during the Cuban Missile Crisis. He then served in the Oklahoma Air National Guard from 1976 to 1998 and was deployed during Operation Desert Shield. He was Catholic in faith and was a charter member of Oklahoma Dirt Riders Motorcycle Club and a member of the Oklahoma City Woodcarvers Club. In his enjoyed time, he camping, spare woodcarving, and riding motorcycles. As a woodcarver Les always shared his ideas about carving and willingly helped many improve their skills. Over the years Les served as Show Chairman and worked to make carving opportunities for many. He always enjoyed his time carving with friends.

He is survived by his wife of 54 years, Joyce Stotler, of Newcastle; two daughters, Barbara Dobbins and Susan McClintick; two sons, David Stotler, Jr. of Oklahoma City and Thomas Stotler of Tennessee; a host of grandchildren, nieces and nephews; and many other loved ones and friends.



Tim Hataway Born: 5/26/1944 Died: 3/11/2016

EDMOND Tim J. Hataway was born to Thelma & James Hataway May 26, 1944, in OKC. Tim graduated from John Marshall High School in 1962 and was a star wrestler. He and his wife to be, Barbara Stubblefield, met on June 7, 1964, and were married on Nov. 7, 1964. They were married over 51 years at the time of his death. Tim served in the U.S. Navy for three years in Olathe, KS. While there, they had their daughter, Shawna Ann, who passed away in 2014 at the age of 47. Tim joined the OKC Fire Department in 1971, retiring in 2000 at the rank of major. He was given the honor of Firefighter of the Year in 1991 and was also honored by the Committee of 100 with a Special Recognition the same year. First and always, he was a Christian and was a member of Quail Springs Baptist Church in Oklahoma City. He was ordained as a deacon at the age of 27 and served faithfully in that capacity for many years. He was one of the heroes at the time of the OKC Bombing, where he was one of the leading forces in creating OKC's own Critical Incident Stress Management team. He also spent 10 days at Ground Zero in NYC and helped many of the FDNY firefighters deal with the losses they had sustained. He visited over 35 fire stations in NYC. He was a hero to many, but none more than his family. After retirement, Tim served on the Oklahoma Council on Aging as Chairman for many years and was able to get a lot accomplished to help the elderly. He was also an Ombudsman at Grace Living Center in Edmond and served on the State Board for the Ombudsmen. At the age of 64, he began woodcarving and found his true love for carving. He did caricatures, human busts and figures, firefighters, cowboys and Indians. He had many blue ribbons in his craft and was highly

thought of by woodcarvers across the U.S. He was quick to help others and gained a reputation for his expertise in woodcarving. Tim was a member of the OKC Woodcarver's Club. Tim was preceded in death by his parents; his daughter, Shawna; and his brother, Jim Hataway. He is survived by his loving wife, Barbara, of the home; his daughters, Madison and Meridith Hataway; his grandson, Brock Neely; and his grandson's father, Jon Neely. He also had many nephews, nieces, great- nephews and nieces, and a host of friends, firefighters and church family who loved him dearly. He will be greatly missed.
