#### **IN MEMORIAM**

#### **Earl Cox**

On January 6<sup>th</sup>, longtime club member Earl Cox passed away peacefully in his sleep at the age

of 80. Earl was born in Okmulgee and spent his younger days living on a farm near Beggs. While he was still in grade school, his family moved to Midwest City, where he would continue to live for most of his life.

Earl married his high school sweetheart, Janice, and together they raised three children. During his working career, he served in the National Guard, delivered milk, and worked at Tinker as a warehouseman and then as a computer operator. In 1969 he began taking classes at Central State College while continuing to work full-time. In just four years, he graduated with a bachelor's degree in Business Management. He continued to work with computers, moving his way up the line until he retired as a Chief Systems Analyst after 30 years with Tinker. Soon after, he returned to work there as a consultant for private contractors. After another 10 years, he hung up his hat for good.

His hobbies included carpentry, restoring antique furniture, and working on cars. As most of us know, Earl was also a talented woodcarver. He was an active, involved member of our club, and he once served as president. Always friendly and willing to help when he could, he will be remembered fondly by many.
