John Schaller talks about his skillfully done architectural carving, which was one of four pieces that he brought for show and tell.





Painting a Carved Gnome:



Richard brought four pieces in different stages of completion. The first is a block of wood with a gnome pattern drawn on all the surfaces. The second is an example of a large, carved gnome. The third is a small finished gnome, and the fourth is an identical gnome that he painted as we watched. The patterns can be found in Nikki Reese's book "Carve a World of Gnomes," and is available for \$9.99 through Fox Chapel Publishing.

Richard began by telling us about coating the carvings with mineral oil to prevent the paint from soaking into the wood and spreading. He then began painting with craft paint that had been thinned with a little water.



After the paint is dry, Richard recommends finishing it with a little neutral shoe polish.

Throughout the demo, he gave us useful tips for shading, finishing, and more. Overall, it was a fun evening filled with useful ideas, advice, and a healthy dose of camaraderie.
