Join us as we get ready for the upcoming Artistry in Wood Show. The elements of judging will be the focus this month's meeting.

AT OUR LAST MEETING...

Our June meeting began with the usual business and was followed by Show and Tell, judging practice, and chip carving.



Three of the judges for our upcoming show practiced on the low-relief carving shown above. They used a points-based system for judging three different aspects: carving skill, artistry, and finish. The maximum number of points available in each category were 25, 15, and 10 respectively, for a total of 50 possible points. This carving received an average of

about 20 points altogether, which would probably receive a red or blue ribbon.

At our October show, the entries that do not have any competition in their category will receive a ribbon based on the number of points it receives.

We will continue to hold a judging practice during each of our meetings leading up to the Artistry in Wood show. If you are interested in understanding more about how the carvings will be judged, attending these meetings will be a great way to learn.

Chip Carving Program



President Marvin Jones put together a detailed and well-organized program. He taught us the basics with a Power Point presentation and an illustrated hand-out that included patterns and a lot of helpful information for beginning chipcarvers. He also provided practice boards so that he could help us with a little in-person instruction.



For many, this was a new experience. The hardest part was learning how to hold the knife and make a precise, even cut. Marvin also provided Christmas tree ornament blanks. We hope to see some of the finished results at our upcoming meetings.

Show and Tell:



Richard Dalke shared a comfort bird that he carved from a piece of crepe myrtle. As he cut away the wood, he discovered small insect holes on one side of the bird. He sanded it until it was as smooth as he could make it, but he still wasn't sure whether it would work as a comfort bird or not. In the end, he decided to use it as one, because – like the bird – life can be a little rough sometimes. Fred Self showed us a beautifully detailed walking stick and two carvings that he started in Debbe Edwards class last summer.



Evan Vinson shared a small caricature carving and a spoon mule, which can be used for carving spoons. When it's unfolded, Evan can rest the part that holds the spoon on the seat of his chair, allowing him to use both hands to scoop out the bowl of the spoon.
